Red slips

Whilst we operate a positive and supportive behaviour system in school, on occasions some children continue making the wrong choices and will receive a red slip. The 'Red Slip' system forms part of our behaviour management policy. Pupils who receive a 'Red Slip' may have either been underlined or double underlined, depending on their response to instruction or the severity of the incident.

We have recently been trialling sending 'Red Slips' home on the day of any incident, with the action from the school noted. This is so that parents are informed regularly as to what has happened and how the school has actioned the said incident. If a pupil received more than two 'Red Slips' in a week then parents are contacted by the school. This is so that we can work in close partnership with you in supporting pupils making the right choices.

After lunch, we walked to the bird hides and looked at the birds on the water with our binoculars. We saw coots with their young and lapwing geese. As we walked back to the Centre, we had a scavenger hunt. We collected our bits and pieces and came back to school tired and happy...

The next day we wrote our own scavenger hunt list and Mrs Holland laminated them so we could take them home to enjoy with our families.

Year 1.

The children have enjoyed our Brazilian Topic. We "kicked off" the term with football and multi-skills, which the children thoroughly enjoyed.

In English, the children investigated Brazilian and English footballers and created a non-fiction booklet about Ronaldinho and Beckham. We looked at Brazilian and English geography and used Beetbots to navigate our way around maps.
